

## PROP 47 POTENTIAL OFFENSES

Note: This list represents the offenses that may potentially qualify under Prop 47 at this time. There is some disagreement among attorneys, prosecutors and courts on the “definitive” list of Prop 47 offenses. As litigation around Prop 47 becomes more settled, courts may hold that some of these offenses do not qualify.

### Simple Possession:

- HS § 11350 – Controlled Substance
- HS § 11357(a) – Concentrated Cannabis
- HS § 11377 – Methamphetamine

### Property Crimes – **MUST BE UNDER \$950**

- PC § 459 – Burglary [must be shoplifting]
- PC § 460(b) – Second Degree Burglary [must be shoplifting]
- PC § 470 – Forgery
- PC § 471 – Forgery
- PC § 472 – Forgery
- PC § 473 - Forgery
- PC § 475 - Forgery
- PC § 476 – Forgery
- PC § 476a – Fraud/Bad Checks
- PC § 484e – Grand Theft
- PC § 484f – Forgery
- PC § 484g – Theft
- PC § 484h – Theft
- PC § 484i(b) – Forgery
- PC § 484.1 – Theft
- PC § 487 – Grand Theft [if 487(a), prior to 1/1/2011; if 487(b)(3), prior to 1/25/2010]
- PC § 487a – Grand Theft
- PC § 487b – Grand Theft
- PC § 487d – Grand Theft
- PC § 487e – Grand Theft [prior to 1/25/2010]
- PC § 487h – Grand Theft [prior to 1/25/2010]
- PC § 487i – Grand Theft
- PC § 496(a) – Receiving Stolen Property
- PC § 666 – Petty Theft with Prior
- VC § 10851 – Joyriding/Taking Automobile Without Permission (\*pending CA Supreme Court decision)

### DISQUALIFYING OTHER CONVICTIONS

Client is disqualified from any Prop 47 reclassification if they have any of the following convictions, regardless of timing in relation to Prop 47 case:

- Offenses listed in PC 667(e)(2)(C)(iv)
  - Violent sex offenses, some sex offenses against minor under 14
  - Homicide (including solicitation/attempt & vehicular homicide while intoxicated)
  - Possession of WMD
  - Assault on peace officer with assault weapon/rifle
  - Other offense punishable by life in prison or death
- Offense requiring sex offender registration under PC § 290(c)

Client is disqualified from Prop 47 reclassification for particular offenses in the following cases:

- For reclassification of PC 666, disqualified by any conviction for PC 368(d) or (e) that happened **before the offense being reclassified**
- For reclassification of PC 476a, disqualified by 3 or more convictions for PC 470, 475, 476 or 476a that happened **before the offense being reclassified**
- For reclassification of any forgery, disqualified by conviction for PC 530.5 that happened **at the same time**

## LA COUNTY COURTHOUSES FOR PROP 47

**NOTE: The following are guidelines for where to file cases, and will work for most cases. There may be some cases that do not fit this pattern, due administrative court transfers, inconsistent procedures at times, and court closures. If your case does not fit the guidelines below, when you attempt to file the clerk will tell you the correct court.**

Prop 47 petitions must be filed at the felony courthouse that owns the case. In most cases, you can tell the court by looking at the case number. In LA County, modern felony case numbers start with two letters, followed by six numbers. You can tell the courthouse by looking at the letters, as follows:

### Courthouses by Case Letters

BA – Clara Shortridge Foltz	NA – Long Beach (aka Deukmejian)
EA – Glendale	PA – San Fernando
GA – Pasadena	SA – Airport
KA – Pomona South	TA – Compton
LA – Van Nuys West	VA – Norwalk
MA – Antelope Valley (aka Lancaster)	YA – Torrance or Inglewood

Older cases will not have the first letter – they will only begin with “A”. Most of those should reflect the correct courthouse or district on the RAP sheet. If the RAP sheet shows a district, file as follows:

### District Courthouses

Central – Clara Shortridge Foltz	Northwest – Van Nuys West
East – Pomona South	South – Long Beach (aka Deukmejian)
North – Antelope Valley (aka Lancaster)	South Central – Compton
North Central – Glendale	Southeast – Norwalk
North Valley – San Fernando	Southwest – Torrance or Inglewood (usually Torrance)
Northeast – Pasadena	West – Airport

**NOTE:** If a DOJ RAP sheet lists “Metro” as the courthouse, it may be either Norwalk or Clara Shortridge Foltz. It should be filed at Clara Shortridge if it is a BA case or an A case with LAPD or CHP as the arresting agency. It should be filed in Norwalk if it is a VA case or an A case with a different arresting agency.
